**Research Analysis**

The second proposed committee substitute to HB 3369 exempts mobile food vehicles that do not have an automatic fire extinguishing system from the requirement to install them according to current code, as long as they have at least two portable fire extinguishers installed in their vehicles and all employees receive annual fire safety training.

In its current form, HB 3369 allows food trucks to operate without an automatic fire extinguishing system if they have at least two portable fire extinguishers and provide annual fire safety training to all employees.
