**Research Analysis**

The proposed subcommittee substitute for HB 3390 adds that the Provider Search website must include a link to the State Department of Health to be able to report an issue with an agency.

HB 3390 requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to update and maintain its Provider Search website that locates agencies that provide services for the Home and Community Based programs listed in the measure. The website must also include a rating system, inspection reports, substantiated complaints, administrator information, and a link to the State Department of Health to be able to report an issue with an agency. DHS will require agencies to update information annually.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3390 requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to update and maintain its Provider Search website for Home and Community Based Services. The updates include adding a rating system, inspection reports, substantiated complaints, administrator information, and a link to the State Department of Health (OSDH) to report an issue with an agency.

According to DHS, implementing this initiative would require cross-agency collaboration with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA), OSDH, and DHS, as well as the development of a locator tool and rating mechanism. It would also require two (2) full-time positions:

- 1 Developer at \$142,500 per year
- 1 PFR at \$102,175 per year

The total fiscal impact is estimated at \$244,675, with \$126,613 from state funds and \$118,062 from federal funds. Therefore, HB 3390 would have a \$126,613 impact on the FY27 state budget.
