Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute 2 to HB 3411 requires the Department of Environmental Quality to purchase equipment necessary to test for PFAS in biosolids. Prior to application, a sample of biosolids must be provided to the Department of Environmental Quality or accredited laboratory to determine the amount of PFAS contained within the biosolids. Farmers and ranchers whose lands are being applied with biosolids must be given the results from the DEQ sample test by the entity providing the biosolids. This measure prohibits biosolids application on lands where crops are grown for human consumption. Additionally, biosolids must not be applied in the same place more than once a year. The Department of Environmental Quality must propose rules and implement the requirements of this measure no later than January 1, 2028.

Fiscal Analysis

The second proposed committee substitute to HB 3411 directs the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to conduct testing of biosolids to determine PFAS amounts prior to land application. DEQ has provided the following information regarding the fiscal impact to the agency of implementing the provisions of this measure:

Instrument: \$500,000

\$400,000 - 1- Sciex 5500+ Triple Quad LCMS w/ nitrogen generator

\$100,000 - 2 - Promochrom Solid Phase Extraction (SPE) 04 (\$50,000 each)

Other First Year Costs: \$208,324.13

\$100,000 - supplies - Cost of standards, durables, consumables, chemicals to get the method up and running.

\$108,324.13 - One Full Time Chemist (salary + benefits)

Recurring annual costs: \$238,324.13

\$80,000 - Annual Instrument Maintenance Contract - \$60,000 for Sciex 5500+ Tripple Quad and \$20,000 for Promochrom Solid Phase Extraction

\$50,000 - Supplies

\$108,324.13 - One Full Time Chemist (salary + benefits)
