**Research Analysis**

**HB3413**, as introduced, requires state agencies to include detailed information on their use of contractors and consultants in annual budget submissions. The report must specify contract amounts, status, and whether the contract addresses staffing or service needs. Agencies must also outline actions taken based on consultant recommendations and publicly post consultant reports on the state’s purchasing website.

**Fiscal Analysis**

House Bill 3413 amends county purchasing statutes by revising competitive bidding and procurement procedures at the county level. Specifically, agencies are required to report certain details on contractors and publicly post final consultant reports under certain circumstances. Any administrative costs associated with implementation are expected to be absorbable within existing budgetary resources. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
