**Research Analysis**

The proposed policy committee substitute 1 to HB 3646 establishes standards for energy storage resources and wind energy facilities and creates the Oklahoma Solar Energy Development Act.

This measure requires that energy storage resources:

- Must comply with international and national fire safety standards;
- Pass pre-construction requirements;
- Must maintain an emergency operations plan on-site detailing:
  - Risk mitigation;
  - Shutdown procedures;
  - Communication protocols; and
  - Environmental safety.
- Provide training to local first responders at no cost; and
- Must not be subject to additional unique rules imposed by political subdivisions.

For wind energy facilities, this measure requires:

- Permit review fees established by the State Fire Marshall. These fees:
  - Are to be no more than \$0.06 per square foot; and
  - Are to be distributed with 75 percent of fee revenues assigned to local fire departments and 25 percent retained to the State Fire Marshall.
- Site plans reviews to be completed within Thirty (30) days.

For the "Solar Energy Development Act", this measure:

- Applies to solar facilities delivering less than 1 MW AC to the grid; and
- Provides for Landowner protections.

This measure also requires:

- Annual reporting of device generation, nameplate capacity, and location to the Corporation Commission;
- An intent to build notice must be filed 6 months before construction. Notice must also be provided to governmental entities, mineral rights holders, and oil or gas operators; and
- That construction cannot begin until all notices and meetings are completed.

This measure requires solar energy facility site plans:

- Are reviewed by the State Fire Marshall with permit fees of no more than \$0.06 per square foot and capped at Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000); and
- Allocate 75 percent of fee revenues to local fire departments.

This measure also requires decommissioning financial assurance and designates exclusive rule making authority to the Corporation Commission.
