**Research Analysis**

The policy committee amendment for HB 3552 provides that the provisions of the measure are contingent on the approval by the Administration for Children and Families.

HB 3552 provides that a licensed or permitted childcare provider servicing a child eligible for the Child Care Subsidy Program may charge the parent or guardian the difference between the subsidy reimbursement rate applicable to the child and the provider's standard private tuition rate. The Department of Human Services must not penalize a provider for charging a differential or take adverse action against a provider solely for charging a differential. Providers who charge a differential must apply it uniformly to all similarly situated families. The Department must promulgate rules and other actions needed to comply with this measure.
