Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to HB 3567 prohibits candidates from expending campaign funds to compensate themselves for any consulting, managing, strategizing, media relations, compliance, or administrative services for their own campaign. Compensation to a family member, another elected official, or another registered candidate must be paid directly from the candidates campaign account. Additionally, any recipients of campaign funds are prohibited from directly or indirectly providing anything of value to the candidate or a family member for services rendered to the candidate's own campaign or any other campaign for public office. Any vendor who a candidate pays more than \$2,000 during an election cycle must file an anti-kickback certification. Violators may face civil penalties, restitution of unlawful expenditures, and referral for criminal prosecution.

Fiscal Analysis

In its current form, HB 3567 prohibits candidates from using campaign funds for certain expenses. The measure also requires a vendor who is paid more than \$2,000 during an election cycle to file an anti-kickback certification.
