**Research Analysis**

HB 3606 allows a person to be considered for removal of the requirement to register as a sex offender if the person, or a legal guardian acting on behalf of the person, can provide to the court documentation that the person has a permanent medical or cognitive impairment that prevents the person from understanding or complying with the requirements of the Sex Offenders Registration Act.
