**Research Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation to HB 3617 creates the Oklahoma Agriculture Right to Repair Act. This measure requires original equipment manufacturers to make available:

- Documentation;
- Parts and tools required for diagnosis; and
- Maintenance or repairs via an authorized repair provider or equipment manufacturer.

This measure prohibits equipment manufacturers from:

- Preventing the installation or functioning of any otherwise functional part;
- Inhibiting or reducing the functioning of any part or board-level component;
- Creating false or misleading alerts or warnings about parts; and
- Charging additional fees or increased prices for future repairs.

This measure grants the Attorney General the authority to enforce this act. This measure also provides exceptions for original equipment manufacturers and applies to equipment manufactured or sold on or after the effective date of this act.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation to HB 3617 requires original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) to provide necessary materials in order for their products to be repaired by independent repair providers. The measure grants the Attorney General the authority to enforce the provisions of this measure. Upon review, this measure has no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state.
