**Research Analysis**

HB3620, as introduced, establishes the *2030 Census Complete Count Committee* and creates a framework for statewide outreach and participation in the 2030 Decennial Census. The 16-member committee will include:

- 4 legislative appointees: one each by the House Speaker, Senate President Pro Tempore, Senate Minority Leader, and House Minority Leader;
- 6 state/local government representatives: two each appointed by the Governor, House Speaker, and Senate President Pro Tempore;
- 3 nonprofit/private sector representatives: one each appointed by the Governor, House Speaker, and Senate President Pro Tempore; and
- 3 representatives of ethnic or language minority communities: one each appointed by the Governor, House Speaker, and Senate President Pro Tempore.
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The committee will receive staff support from the State Data Center and is tasked with developing and implementing a comprehensive outreach strategy, including:

- State agency initiatives to encourage census participation;
- School-based outreach programs;
- Partnerships with nonprofit and community organizations; and
- A multilingual, multimedia awareness campaign.

The committee must submit annual recommendations to the Legislature and Governor. Appointments are due by March 1, 2027, the first meeting must occur by July 1, 2027, and a final report on activities is due by June 1, 2030.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3620 creates the 2030 Census Complete Count Committee, comprised of sixteen (16) members. These members would receive no compensation, but members shall be eligible for travel reimbursement from their appointing authority or legislative body from which they serve. Staffing costs will be the responsibility of the Legislative Service Bureau. All costs are expected to be minimal and absorbed within existing budgetary resources.
