**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3638 directs the Department of Human Services (DHS) to implement and administer the Summer Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) program, which provides grocery benefits to families during the summer months. The measure creates the Summer EBT Program Revolving Fund within DHS for administrative costs but does not appropriate funds to the account.

DHS estimates the total program cost at approximately \$9,937,129, with a 25%/75% split, \$2,484,282 from federal funds and \$7,452,847 from state funds. Because the measure does not appropriate any funds, the fiscal impact remains contingent on future appropriations to the revolving fund.
