**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB 3673 allows certain electrician licenses expired for over a year to be renewed without reexamination if the applicant submits a renewal form, pays the annual and accrued late fees, completes the required continuing education for the expired period and an extra six hours per year of expiration, and proves their good standing. These reinstatement rules apply to the unlimited journeyman license, residential journeyman license, unlimited contractor license, residential contractor license, and limited contractor license.

Additionally, the Construction Industries Board, following recommendations from the Committee of Electrical Examiners, must establish rules for continuing education requirements within 180 days of the measure's effective date.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute to HB 3673 establishes renewal or reinstatement guidelines for certain expired electrical licenses.
