**Research Analysis**

HB 3673, as introduced, requires all electrical licenses to expire each year on the licensee's birthday and allows renewal within 30 days before or after expiration. Licenses renewed more than 30 days late are subject to late fees and continuing education requirements.

An unlimited or residential journeyman electrician license expired for more than one year may be renewed if the applicant submits a renewal form, pays the annual and accrued late fees, completes the required continuing education for the expired period and an extra six hours per year of expiration, and proves their good standing.

The measure also repeals the section of law regulating the current electrical license and registration terms.
