**Research Analysis**

HB 3682, as introduced, creates the "Oklahoma Clean Indoor Air Act," which prohibits smoking in indoor workplaces, government buildings, restaurants and bars, public transportation, health care facilities, educational institutions, retail stores and malls, and sports arenas and stadiums. The measure allows smoking in tobacco shops and cigar bars, private residences that are not used for childcare or health care services, designated smoking rooms in hotels, and on tribal lands and reservations. Establishments must have clear signage that states "No Smoking" at entrances and throughout the facilities. The State Department of Health will promulgate rules for enforcement and local governments and municipalities are allowed to enact stricter ordinances.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3682 creates the Oklahoma Clean Indoor Air Act and directs the State Department of Health (OSDH) to promulgate rules for enforcement. OSDH confirmed the requirements can be implemented within existing resources; therefore, the measure is not expected to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
