Research Analysis

The subcommittee recommendation for HB 3706 updates state law regarding math instruction and math screenings. The measure:

- Extends the provisions of the Oklahoma Math Achievement and Proficiency Act to students in grades K – 8. Currently the law is specific to grades 2 - 5.
- Requires elementary schools to provide students in full-day kindergarten through second grade with a minimum of 225 minutes of math instruction each week, and no less than 30 minutes each day;
- Requires elementary schools to provide students in grades three through five with a minimum of 300 minutes of math instruction each week, and no less than 30 minutes each day;
- Requires the pre-existing math screening to occur within 30 days of school beginning;
- Updates the requirements for the notification that is sent to parents about their child's math deficiencies.
