**Research Analysis**

HB 3722 as introduced, requires the State Election Board to notify registered voters if the political party the voter is registered under ceases to be a recognized political party. The registered voter must file a form selecting a new party affiliation to remain registered to vote. The form must be filed within 90 days of notification. Additionally, the measure clarifies that voter registration applications are incomplete if a party affiliation is not selected. The State Election Board is not authorized to select a party affiliation on an incomplete application and must notify the applicant that their application will not be deemed complete until a party affiliation is chosen.

**Fiscal Analysis**

House Bill 3722 amends voter registration statutes by modifying certain registration procedures and related administrative provisions. Any associated administrative adjustments are expected to be absorbed within existing budgetary resources. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
