**Research Analysis**

HB 3728, as introduced, reassigns the regulation of the Oklahoma Scrap Metal Dealers Act from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3728 transfers the responsibility of oversight of scrap metal dealers from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry (ODAFF) to the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). DEQ anticipates the need for one environmental specialist FTE to administer this responsibility at a total salary and benefits cost of Ninety-Eight Thousand Twenty Dollars and Sixty-Eight Cents (\$98,020.68). DEQ would require additional appropriations to cover the cost of this position; therefore, the total fiscal impact of this measure is \$98,020.68.
