**Research Analysis**

The Policy committee substitute to HB 3742 to requires the state to disclose certain information within 30 days of the initial appearance of a defendant. The measure modifies the types of information that must be disclosed, including types of law enforcement records and full contact information of all eyewitnesses interviewed by law enforcement and all photographs and line up materials and all reports made as a result of examinations made in connection with a particular case. The measure outlines the types of material that must be turned over to the defense. Motions for discovery may be made at any time and all issues related to discovery must be completed at least 30 days prior to trial. Currently, these issues must be completed within 10 days of trial. The measure outlines the procedures the court is to take if a party violates a disclosure obligation.
