Research Analysis

HB 3765 provides that any alien or non-citizen who has unlawfully acquired title to or owns land through a business entity, trust, or foreign government enterprise, and who uses such land to commit a felony offense is guilty of a felony punishable by up to 2 years imprisonment, a fine of not more than \$1,000 or both fine and imprisonment. The property is also subject to forfeiture.

Fiscal Analysis

This measure creates the new crime of alien or non-citizen person unlawfully acquiring or owning land in the state of Oklahoma either directly or indirectly through certain means for certain purposes. Persons convicted of such an offense shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term not to exceed 2 years, or by a fine not to exceed \$1,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Any resulting change to the revenues collected by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) or change in the costs incurred by the Department of Corrections (DOC) are expected to be immaterial and/or absorbed by the agencies. Therefore, this measure in its current form is anticipated to be budget neutral.
