**Research Analysis**

HB 3783, as introduced, allows registered plumbing apprentices to take the journeyman exam before completing the required one year of plumbing experience if they meet the following criteria:

- At least 17 years old;
- Registered as an apprentice;
- Completed an approved education program with a minimum score of 70 percent in all courses;
- Provide transcripts and certificates; and
- Submit an endorsed plumbing apprentice application.

If the endorsed apprentice completes one year of experience within three years of passing the exam and is at least 18 years old, they can apply for a journeyman license without retaking the exam.
