**Research Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation to HB 3848 creates the Transient Sex Offender Elimination Act and establishes guidelines for program houses which provide housing, supervision, and access to rehabilitative programming for registered sex offenders. Incarcerated sex offenders must complete victim impact and life skills curricula approved by the Department before release, with monitored enrollment and completion. Released sex offenders must participate in approved recovery curricula upon arrival at program houses, including step-based recovery programs, job readiness education, and support group participation or therapy. The measure requires that the provisions of the act apply retroactively to all persons currently classified as sex offenders in Oklahoma.
