Research Analysis

The committee substitute to HB 3940 updates references to the joint force headquarters.

The measure authorizes the Adjutant General to redefine the purpose of any bequest to the Military Department of Oklahoma if the original purpose is covered by another section of law or source of funding.

This measure renames the Oklahoma National Guard Retirement Pay Revolving Fund to the Oklahoma National Guard Supplemental Pay Revolving Fund. This measure delays the operative date of the Oklahoma National Guard Supplemental Retirement Pay Revolving Fund until January 1, 2027, or until funds are appropriated, whichever date is earlier. This section is not applicable to members receiving federal benefits and bases the amount of retirement members receive on total points accrued.

The measure allows officers to impose a reduction to the next inferior paygrade on members on which judicial penalties have been imposed. Active duty members must respond to judicial punishment within 3 days.

This measure creates the Christopher A. Rau Act pertaining to a career and technology education for eligible guard members and provides eligibility requirement for the Oklahoma National Guard CareerTech Assistance Program.

This measure designates the Oklahoma National Guard Museum Fund specifically to the Oklahoma Military Department and requires proceeds and revenue generated from the following sources to be deposited into the fund:

- Oklahoma National Guard Museum rentals;
- Oklahoma National Guard Museum giftshop;
- Armed Forces Veteran Motorcycle License Plates; and
- Global War on Terrorism License Plates.

Fiscal Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 3940 does not materially alter the prior fiscal impact statement. The measure updates eligibility requirements and financial structures under existing programs. No revenue sources are altered, nor are any additional appropriations required by the new

language. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations
