**Research Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation to HB 4060, creates the Plug-In Solar Power Amendments Act. This measure provides criteria for qualifying portable solar devices and limits authorization, fees, metering, and indemnification a utility can require.

This measure requires portable solar generation devices to comply with nationally recognized electrical safety standards and limits liability for electric utilities for any damage, injury, or loss cause by a portable solar generation device. Retail electric customers bear responsibility for the proper installation and maintenance of portable solar generation devices.

This measure authorizes the Corporation Commission to adopt administrative rules solely necessary to enforce the provisions of this act or to ensure compliance with applicable safety standards. Nothing in this act:

- Authorizes compensation for exported electricity;
- Modifies existing distributed generation or net metering programs; or
- Limits the authority of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission over traditional interconnection of electric facilities.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation to HB 4060 establishes various statutory requirements regarding portable solar generation devices and allows the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC) to adopt proper administrative rules to enforce the provisions of the measure. Upon review, the OCC anticipates minimal rule promulgation costs as a result of this measure that would be absorbable into the agency's current budgetary resources.
