Research Analysis

HB 4112 removes the ability to assess and collect various fees on defendants. The measure removes the following fee assessments:

\$150 forensic or laboratory services fee;
\$150 DNA fee for certain offenses;
\$40 monthly district attorney non-supervision fee;
\$6 Law Library fund fee;
Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act fee;

Beginning November 1, 2026, the unpaid balance of any Laboratory Analysis fee, DNA fee, fingerprinting fee, or Forensic Science Improvement Assessment fee owed by a defendant in his or her criminal case shall be waived and deemed unenforceable and uncollectible. Any portion of a judgment imposing such fees is to be vacated. If a defendant has received qualifying benefits or income for at least six of the past twelve months, they are presumed unable to pay court financial obligations, and the court must waive these obligations. A document showing receipt of such benefits for six of the past twelve months must be accepted as conclusive evidence by the court. Testimony can be given orally or by affidavit. If a defendant has received qualifying benefits or income for less than six of the past twelve months, the presumption that the defendant is unable to pay is rebuttable.

Beginning November 1, 2026, the unpaid balance of any fee assessed for the costs of supervision by the district attorney owed by a defendant in his or her criminal case is to be waived and deemed unenforceable and uncollectible. Any portion of a judgment imposing such fees is to be vacated.

The measure repeals [20 O.S. Section 1313.3](#) relating to fingerprinting fees and [20 O.S. Section 1313.4](#) related to Forensic Science Improvement Assessment.
