**Research Analysis**

HB 4148, as introduced, creates the Oklahoma Kids After-School Grant Program which allows the Department of Human Services to provide grants to community-based organizations that run after school programs for students in grades K-12. The programs must offer reading assistance or tutoring that is based in the science of reading. Eligible organizations may also qualify for an exemption from the Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act if they fall under existing exemptions in state law and operate a least five locations.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 4148 establishes the Oklahoma Kids After-School Grant Program (OKAGP) and creates the OKAGP Revolving Fund within the Department of Human Services (DHS) to administer grants to after-school programs that offer reading assistance.

Awarded grants are contingent on available funds, and HB 4148 does not appropriate any money to the Fund. As a result, the measure currently has no direct fiscal impact on the state budget.

**Other Considerations**

Estimated staffing costs from DHS to administer:

1 position, Contracting and Acquisition agent at \$112,500 – could administer approximately \$3,000,000 - \$5,000,000 in grant funds annually and monitor 5 – 10 entities.
