Fiscal Analysis

The SUBREC to HB4190 creates the Cyber Crime and Fraud Unit within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) and appropriates \$3,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to establish and operate the unit. The measure also creates the OSBI Cyber Crime and Fraud Unit Revolving Fund in the State Treasury. The appropriated funds are designated for personnel costs (agents, analysts, forensic examiners, and support staff), technology and digital forensics equipment, training and certifications, and operational expenses necessary to support cyber-crime and fraud investigations. Officials with OSBI have provided the following cost breakdown related to the provisions of the measure:

The new Cyber Crime and Fraud Unit would require the following to operate:

Personnel	\$2,355,000
Annual training	\$285,000
Annual software licenses	\$360,000
Equipment - vehicles, weapons, computers, etc.	<u>\$500,000</u>
	Total Cost: \$3,243,500

According to those officials, the \$3,000,000 appropriation set forth by the measure will cover the costs associated with the new unit, and any costs above that appropriation are likely to be absorbed using existing budgetary resources. Therefore, in its current form, this measure makes a direct appropriation of \$3,000,000 to OSBI and the agency would use those funds to defray the expected \$3,243,500 ongoing operational costs from administering the Cyber Crime and Fraud Unit.
