**Research Analysis**

The proposed policy committee substitute for HB 4200 directs the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to develop a public-private partnership called the "Forensic Assertive Community Treatment Program." The program's purpose is to provide an investment in the development and implementation of forensic assertive community treatment teams across the state to prevent and address homelessness and decreasing recidivism for criminal justice-involved individuals with serious mental illness. The Program must address, but is not limited to, the following:

- Creation of a Tulsa County, Oklahoma County, and a rural forensic assertive community treatment team with additional teams determined by community need and funding;
- Identification of the population most in need of intense community-based psychiatric services;
- Development or adoption of a tool to measure the fidelity of the forensic assertive community treatment teams; and
- Development of partnerships within local communities to assist in the provision of the Program.

The Program will be administered by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and funding for the creation of each forensic assertive community treatment team will be subject to the commitment of 25% matching funding from a private source up to \$1 million from the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services for each team. The measure also creates the "Forensic Assertive Community Treatment Program Revolving Fund."

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 4200 directs the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (ODMHSAS) to administer the Forensic Assertive Community Treatment Program. The measure authorizes ODMHSAS to form public-private partnerships and establishes the Forensic Assertive Community Treatment Program Revolving Fund to support program implementation.

ODMHSAS has been contacted regarding potential fiscal implications for the agency. As ODMHSAS provides feedback on potential costs, this impact will be updated.
