Fiscal Analysis

HB 4200 directs the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (ODMHSAS) to administer the Forensic Assertive Community Treatment Program. The measure authorizes ODMHSAS to form public-private partnerships and establishes the Forensic Assertive Community Treatment Program Revolving Fund to support program implementation.

ODMHSAS estimates the measure will cost between \$41,577,187 and \$130,185,123. This includes evaluations for 3,637 homeless individuals not already receiving mental health services, occurring seven times per year on the low end and up to fifty-two times per year on the high end, at a cost of \$5,324,495 to \$39,553,393. From these evaluations, an estimated 10% - 25% of individuals will require placement in an urgent recovery clinic or crisis stabilization unit, with associated costs of \$36,252,692 to \$90,631,730. Therefore, the total estimated fiscal impact of HB 4200 ranges from \$41,577,187 to \$130,185,123 and would require additional appropriation in the full amount to ODMHSAS.
