HB 4202, as introduced, removes the reimbursement rate for non-magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) radiology procedures under workers' compensation.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 4202 removes language that sets a specific reimbursement rate for all other radiology procedures other than magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) services within Oklahoma's workers' compensation system. In its current form, HB 4202 is not expected to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
