**Research Analysis**

HB 4277, as introduced, modifies state law regarding athletic eligibility for students who have transferred schools. The measure allows a transfer student to play sports unless, upon a formal due process hearing, they are found to have violated a governing athletic association's rule.

The measure also prohibits an athletic association from dictating how a school district can use their athletic facilities, and provides districts with a cause of action against an association for any attempts to control their facilities.
