**Research Analysis**

HB 4302, as introduced, gives the Office of Juvenile System Oversight the authority to subpoena child or juvenile records maintained by state-operated and privately-operated entities in the children and youth service system. The measure also adds that the Office of Juvenile System Oversight cannot release personally identifying information unless disclosing the information is needed to protect the safety of others if the complainant has communicated an explicit threat. In that case, the Office will have taken reasonable precautions if they communicate the threat to the reasonably identified person and notified an appropriate law enforcement agency.
