**Research Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation for HB 4302 removes the language that requires the Office of Juvenile System Oversight to subpoena child or juvenile records maintained by state- and privately-operated entities within the children and youth system. Additionally, the disclosure of certain information to the appropriate local law enforcement agency is needed to protect the safety of others when a complainant communicates a threat against an individual or entity.
