**Fiscal Analysis**

House Bill 4320 creates new law requiring state agencies to conduct a comprehensive review of permanent rules, repeal or amend at least twenty-five percent of such rules within two years, and submit annual compliance reports. OMES reports that some additional agency workload is to be anticipated. However, when reaching out to specific agencies such as the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC), such costs are expected to be absorbable. The measure does not appropriate funds, and any additional administrative workload is expected to be absorbed within existing budgetary resources. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
