Research Analysis

The proposed policy committee substitute for HB 4336 clarifies the violations for administering unauthorized pain management treatments. A physician practicing interventional pain management without the appropriate license violates either the Oklahoma Allopathic and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act or the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act and may face disciplinary actions that could include license revocation. Similarly, a nurse who engages in interventional pain management without proper supervision is violating the Nursing Practice Act and is subject to discipline that could also lead to license revocation.

Fiscal Analysis

The proposed policy committee substitute for HB 4336 amends the Oklahoma Interventional Pain Management and Treatment Act by updating definitions, clarifying supervision requirements for registered nurses under certain circumstances, and establishing that violations are subject to disciplinary penalties under the applicable medical or nursing practice acts. The measure primarily affects professional regulation and enforcement activities of certain medical boards, but does not create a new state program or appropriate state funds. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
