**Research Analysis**

The proposed policy committee substitute for HB 4454 provides that an edible medical marijuana product must not contain more than 10 milligrams of THC per individual serving and requires packages of edible marijuana products to clearly indicate the number of servings of THC in each package and the amount of THC in each individual serving. The polpcs removes the limits on servings in each package and in drinks that the introduced version contained. Edible medical marijuana products intended to be consumed as a drink or beverage must not contain more than 10 milligrams of THC per individual serving and drinks must clearly indicate the number of servings in each drink and the amount of THC in each individual serving.

HB 4454 requires that edible medical marijuana products contain no more than 10 milligrams of THC per serving. Edible medical marijuana products intended to be consumed as a drink must not contain more than 10 milligrams of THC per serving. Edible medical marijuana products must not be attractive to children, be made in the shape of humans, cartoons or animals, be made in a form of commercially available candy, or contain any color additives.
