**Research Analysis**

SB 1054 makes changes to the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program. The measure expands the scholarship to include students outside of the Tulsa Public School district who are direct lineal descendants of Tulsa Race Massacre victims, and who plan to attend some form of higher education in Oklahoma. The measure removes the income requirement for directly-descended students.

Students who attend Tulsa Public Schools, but are not direct descendants of Massacre victims must have a family income of \$125,000 or less to qualify for a Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship.

The State Regents are directed to prioritize the descendants of victims when awarding scholarships. The Regents must receive assistance from a community advisory committee, which is created in the measure.
