## **Research Analysis**

SB 216 tolls the expiration date of the driver license of an inmate which expired within the last three years during the person's term of imprisonment for a period of six months after the inmate is released from the custody of the Department of Corrections. The measure clarifies procedures for the reinstatement of a revoked or suspended driver license by requiring Service Oklahoma to notify the license holder within three days of reinstatement that the license holder must apply for a new driver license. The Department of Corrections is to provide inmates with documentation to obtain a provisional license before being released from custody.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

Engrossed SB 216 extends the expiration date of driver licenses for certain persons in the custody of the Department of Corrections. The measure requires that such persons are mailed a replacement driver license by Service Oklahoma and provided relevant documentation by the Department of Corrections required for obtaining a provisional license. The Department of Corrections is anticipated to require \$15,000 in additional hours of labor for implementation of the measure. However, the cost is minimal and will be absorbed by existing agency resources.
