Research Analysis

SB 31 creates a financial assistance program to help eligible National Guard members pay for a certification or licensure program at a CareerTech school for a maximum of three years.

To be eligible, a member of the National Guard must:

- Have at least one year left on their enlistment contract, and agree in writing to complete it; and
- Agree in writing to serve actively for at least 24 months after completion of the last semester for which they receive assistance.

To maintain eligibility they must:

- Maintain a 2.0 GPA;
- Maintain satisfactory participation in the Guard; and
- Possess a Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) or Air Force Specialty Code (AFSC) after his or her first semester.

A Guard member who has received assistance but fails to comply with the provisions of the program will be required to repay an amount as calculated in the measure. The measure allows a Guard member to apply for a hardship waiver in certain circumstances. A Guard member must apply for all federal education grants and scholarships before seeking assistance through this scholarship.

Fiscal Analysis

The engrossed version of the measure is not anticipated to result in a negative fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations. However, for additional insight, the average in-district student tuition and fees is approximately \$2,170.
