Research Analysis

The engrossed version of SB 391 dissolves the Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board and moves the duties of the Board to the Attorney General's office. Any entity from which the Attorney General requests records in accordance with these duties will give those records to the Attorney General. The Attorney General may assign any of these powers and duties to any of the office's assistants or employees. The measure repeals 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-1002 which outlines the makeup of the Board.

Fiscal Analysis

The Engrossed version of SB391 transfers duties related to addressing overdose deaths from the Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board within the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (DMHSAS) to the Office of the Attorney General (OAG). Officials with the OAG have provided the following information:

The OAG does not anticipate needing additional resources to implement the provisions of SB391. OAG personnel have staffed and assisted the board in the past and, contingent upon the cooperation with other agencies that is set forth in the bill, the OAG should be able to administer this bill with existing staff.

Therefore, in its current form, there is no anticipated material impact to state budget or appropriations as a result of SB391.
