## **Research Analysis**

The engrossed version of SB 423 authorizes a health care provider or facility to impose a reasonable, cost-based fee when patients or their representatives request copies of medical records. Requests for medical records and bills from, ore directed to, attorneys, insurance companies, other third parties, and by way of subpoena will be charged a base fee of \$23 and a per page fee of \$0.67 per page for printed copies and \$0.40 per page for electronic copies. The charge for these records will in no event exceed \$270. If images or provided on a CD/DVD, the fee will be \$23 per CD/DVD or other electronic media. It will be unlawful for a covered entity to use or disclose protected health information except as authorized by HIPAA. Intentional violation of this will be deemed unprofessional conduct and be subject to license revocation and upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable with an up to \$1,000 fine. If the covered entity believes that a violation has or will occur in relation to requesting medical records, then the covered entity apply to a court of competent jurisdiction for relief.
