Research Analysis

SB 921 clarifies that a person participating in the IDAP program will not be subject to revocation if the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence receives the request for IDAP participation and payment of the program fees within 30 calendar days from the date of the receipt of the revocation notice from Service Oklahoma.

Fiscal Analysis

SB 921 modifies a certain time requirement such that a person with a driving record subject to revocation may be updated to indicate completion of the Impaired Driver Accountability Program (IDAP) without revocation, provided that the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence receives the IDAP participation request and program fee payment within thirty days from receipt of the revocation notice from Service Oklahoma. The prior thirty day time requirement started upon arrest. The measure does not mandate any action or expenditure by a state agency. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
