**Bill Analysis**

SB 1322 provides that anonymous reports of suspected child abuse shall not be accepted by the Department of Human Services. The measure requires the Department to maintain the recording of a hotline tip past the 12-month period if the referral results in an investigation and to make the recording part of the case file. Any person receiving a report of child abuse or neglect shall be required to request and store the specific facts that led to the reasonable suspicion of child abuse or neglect as well as the contact information of the person providing the tip.
