Bill Analysis

SB 1386 directs the Supreme Court to promulgate statewide policies that govern court audio and video recording, broadcasting, livestreaming, and the preservation of public access of judicial records. The measure directs the Administrative Office of the Courts to develop the technical guidelines. Such guideline shall include standards for digitization and storage of recorded media, standards for streaming systems, procedures for portable recording systems, and full compatibility with the Oklahoma Court Information System. The measure provides that statewide policies shall include standards on livestreaming court proceedings. Photographs and streaming shall not include jurors and prospective jurors, minors, victims or witnesses whose identity or personal information is confidential, vulnerable adults whose records or identifying information is confidential, and any other individual whose identity is confidential. The measure provides that the court may restrict recording, broadcasting, or livestreaming upon written findings supported by clear and convincing evidence that a compelling interest requires restriction. The measure provides that all court recording systems shall support the creation of AI-assisted transcripts. The Office shall monitor statewide compliance. The measure also repeals a section of law dealing with court transcripts by videotape.
