**Bill Analysis**

SB 1479 prohibits any first responder or scene support personnel from releasing scene-specific information or transmitting any photographic image or video taken at a collision or crime scene to the public without prior authorization from the investigating agency. The measure establishes a \$1,000.00 maximum fine and/or maximum a term of imprisonment of 60 days for violating the provisions of this measure.
