**Bill Analysis**

SB 1557 transfers duties related to licensure of behavior analysts from the Department of Human Services to the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners. The Board shall have exclusive power and authority to determine the qualifications and fitness of all applicants for admission to practice as a licensed behavior analyst or certified assistant behavior analyst. The measure directs the Board to require all applicants to submit to a criminal history check. The measure provides that the Board may charge reasonable fees, instead of \$100.00, to cover the cost and expense incurred for renewing a license.
