**Bill Analysis**

SB 1664 directs the Supreme Court to promulgate rules governing the use of audio and video recording, broadcasting, and livestreaming systems in all courts in the state. The measure requires livestreaming to be provided for all public proceedings unless technically infeasible. Additionally, the rules shall establish standardized request procedures and advance notice requirements, standardized transcript certification language, and prohibit the photographing and recording of certain individuals outlined in the measure. The rules shall also preserve the authority of the judge to limit or suspend audio and video recording, broadcasting, or livestreaming systems upon specific written findings of fact that such restriction is narrowly tailored and absolutely necessary to protect a compelling state interest. The measure requires records to be retained for at least 10 years or the duration of a case, whichever is longer. The rules shall require the establishment of an online portal for the public to access broadcasts and recordings. The measure requires all felony courts to be fully equipped by January 1, 2026, and all family and civil courts by January 1, 2027. The measure provides that funding for the system shall be secured by Legislative appropriations and authorizes the use of monies in the Oklahoma Court Information System Revolving Fund to secure equipment.
