**Bill Analysis**

SB 1751 creates the Human Trafficking Identification and Reporting Act. The measure directs the Office of the Attorney General to enter into a contract with an administering organization to adopt or designate a digital identification and reporting platform for human trafficking. The measure directs the Office to endorse 1 or more digital identification and reporting platforms. The measure authorizes mandated reporters to utilize the digital identification and reporting platform to report suspected human trafficking. The platform shall facilitate referral to the National Human Trafficking Hotline for crisis support as necessary. The measure also requires the platform to send notifications of high priority reports to designated law enforcement and child protection officials.
