Bill Analysis

SB 1762 creates the Oklahoma Protection of Fundamental Rights and Public Policy Act. The measure prohibits any person from inflicting or threatening to inflict various forms of mutilation as well as stoning or flogging. The measure prohibits any person from threatening physical violence due to perceived acts of perceived immorality, apostasy, blasphemy, or other violations of religious or cultural dress or behavior codes. The measure further outlaws female genital mutilation and establishes a penalty. A person convicted of female genital mutilation shall be subject to a term of imprisonment of 1-5 years and/or a maximum fine of \$20,000.00. Any medical professional that participates in the act shall be subject to license revocation. The measure clarifies that male circumcision is distinct from female genital mutilation. The measure establishes a statute of limitations to prosecute the act at the victim's 45th birthday. Any marriage under the age of 18 shall not be recognized by the state. The measure specifies that only state and common law shall apply to marriages.
