**Bill Analysis**

SB 1886 provides for certain rights to be afforded to students enrolled in and attending an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, including the right to public and free expression of religion, speech, and peaceable assembly; the right to an unbiased education that does not endorse or promote socialism, communism, or Marxism and is free from anti-American bias; the right to an unbiased learning environment free from the display of flags or propaganda of any organization or symbol of socialism, communism, Marxism, or anti-American sentiment; the right to an education free from indoctrination; the right to be free from aggressive hostility toward political speech or expression in verbal or aggressive physical form; the right to be free from institution faculty lowering or exhibiting grading bias for political beliefs or expressing protected freedoms; the right to be free from obscene performances or depictions; and the right to listen to and engage with guest speakers.

The measure requires each institution to create a Free Campus Committee comprised of at least 7 members. It allows enrolled students and faculty to report violations of students' rights to the committee. It directs the Free Campus Committee to create a due process plan for students and faculty. It allows the Free Campus Committee to request that the Attorney General investigate an institution for non-compliance. The measure also creates a cause of action against an institution for violating a student's rights or an institution faculty member for willfully violating a student's rights.
