**Bill Analysis**

SB 1925 modifies the penalties for violating a protection order by adding a minimum term of imprisonment of 6 months. The measure also classifies such a violation that resulted in the injury of the plaintiff as a class D1 felony instead of a misdemeanor. The measure increases the maximum term of imprisonment for the newly created felony from 1 year to 3 years. The measure repeals obsolete language relating to protective orders.
